INTRODUCTION

The Local Heritage Survey for the Shire of Nannup was first created in 1996 in accordance with the requirements of the *Heritage of Western Australia Act 1990* (Section 45) which required the Councils of all local authorities in Western Australia to compile and maintain inventories of buildings within their districts which were, or may become, of cultural heritage significance. These Local Heritage Surveys involved a process of public consultation. The Heritage Council of Western Australia provides guidelines for the preparation of heritage surveys and this survey has been prepared in strict accordance with the *Heritage Act 2018* and State Planning Policy 3.5 Historic Heritage and Conservation.

Originally the preparation of heritage surveys for the Shires of Boyup Brook, Bridgetown/Greenbushes, Manjimup and Nannup were commissioned as a joint project between the South West Development Corporation and the individual Shires. The brief for the project included the preparation of surveys for each Shire and the preparation of a composite heritage strategy for the whole region to be included with the Warren-Blackwood Regional Plan.

The local heritage survey for the Shire of Nannup consists of three sections. Firstly, the thematic framework, secondly the summary site list with preliminary information and management categories for each site and thirdly the detailed assessment of approximately eighty-four sites in accordance with Heritage Council guidelines. Out of 57 sites listed, only twenty-two sites were assessed in detail in the original 1996 Shire of Nannup Municipal Inventory due to the cost restrictions of the project.

Heritage lists were compiled from a number of sources including Shire schedules, the Heritage Council database, and National Trust records. Heritage sites nominated during a program conducted by the South West Heritage Taskforce in 1990 and obtained from the South West Development Commission (previously the South West Development Authority) were also incorporated into the preliminary lists. Additional sites were nominated through the community consultation process.



EXPLANATION OF ASSESSMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The site assessments should be read in conjunction with the thematic framework which provides a summary outline of the history and development of the Shire through time. The framework provides an overview of the history of the Shire organised across time periods pertinent to the development of the region, where possible the date of construction and where possible a brief description and assessment of significance of the site is included and a guide to appropriate management.

The overall level of significance and management categories recognise the varying degrees of importance of heritage places to the community. They reflect the:

Nature of Significance

- Aesthetic value It is significant in exhibiting articular aesthetic characteristics valued by the community.
- Historic value it is significant in the evolution or pattern of the history of Western Australia
- Scientific value Potential to yield information that will contribute to an understanding of the history of the locality or region.
- Social value it is significant through association with a community or cultural group in the locality or region for social, cultural, educational, or spiritual reasons.
- Spiritual value it is significant because it embodies or evokes tangible values and meanings which give it importance in the spiritual identity, or the traditional knowledge, art, and practices of a cultural group.

Rating and Assessment

- Aesthetic value it demonstrates particular aesthetic characteristics valued by the community.
- Rarity it demonstrates rare, uncommon or endangered aspect of the cultural heritage of the local district.
- Architectural merit project that reflects exemplary architectural and urban design and contributes to the public realm.
- Value as part of a group or precinct it is significant in demonstrating the characteristics of a class of cultural places or environments in the local district.
- Condition the current state of the place in relation to the values for which that place has been assessed.
- Integrity the extent to which a building retains its original function.

Management Categories

Places that are considered to be of significant heritage value and worthy of conservation are identified on the Heritage List.

Heritage places with Management categories '1', '2' and '3' are included on the Heritage List while places with a Management Category of '4' are not included on the Heritage List.

THEMATIC FRAMEWORK

1828 - 1850

SETTLEMENT

In 1797 a French exploration party led by D'Entrecasteaux explored the south west coastline. (Berry 1987)

The settlement of Western Australia can be considered to commence with the landing at Fremantle of Captain James Stirling in 1829 and the subsequent establishment of the Swan River colony. In 1830 a townsite was established at Augusta.

In 1831 Lieutenant Preston explored the coastline in a whaleboat. His party was forced to walk overland from west of Point D'Entrecasteaux to Augusta and in the process crossed the Warren and Donnelly Rivers. Also, in 1831 the area was crossed by Captain Bannister and a Mr Smith of the Surveyor-General's Department. In 1834 a party headed by Thomas Turner is recorded to have traced the Blackwood River from its source to its head waters. In 1845 A. C. Gregory explored the Blackwood in the opposite direction. Both of these parties would have passed through the Nannup area. (Gilbert 1973)

PEOPLE

Early explorers and surveyors who prepared the way for later settlement.



SETTLEMENT

Prior to 1850 all land was disposed of by sale. However, in 1850 legislation was passed which made provision for pastoral leases on land more than two miles from the coast, occupied townships or principal rivers. Leases cost 10s. Per 1,000 acres for an eight-year period with the prospect of renewal at the end of that period. (Games 1970) As a direct result settlers began moving into the timber country of the south-west. Grazing leases adjacent to the south coast were also taken up at this period.

In 1852, Assistant Surveyor Augustus Charles Gregory explored extensively in the area of the Blackwood and Donnelly Rivers. Land surveys were undertaken in 1858 by Assistant Surveyor Robert Austin whose report refers to several settlers in the area and to localities later known as Tanjannerup, Dudinalup and Cundinup. (Gilbert 1973)

TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION

Settlers arrived by bullock dray along bush tracks. At this period there were few roads in the area and those that existed were rough and poorly made. However, those that did exist formed the basis for the road network in the area today. The main route into the Nannup area was from Busselton. Convicts constructed the road from Nannup to the Warren House around 1870.

Tracks to the coast were created from the leasehold lands in the interior when the graziers realised the relationship between grazing on the coast and in the inland areas and established grazing cycles.

Stockman's huts were constructed in coastal areas.

The first post office in the Nannup area is recorded in the 1870s.

OCCUPATIONS

The main occupations of the early pioneers were sheep and cattle raising on the pastoral leases, catching wild horses and timber cutting, both to clear the land for grazing and for the growing timber industry. The timber trade was buoyant with markets for jarrah railway sleepers in Eastern Australia and India and for telegraph poles in South Australia. From the 1870s there was a growing demand for railway sleepers in Western Australia.

SOCIAL & CIVIC LIFE

During the early years the settlers' time and energy were directed to survival. There were few community facilities and family, and neighbours had to rely on each other in times of need and for social interaction. Community life was centred on the home. Visits between neighbours, visits from outsiders to the district, church services and occasional picnics were the main social activities.

The first police station in the area is recorded in 1868 (Gilbert 1973).



OUTSIDE INFLUENCES

The introduction of convict transportation in 1850 had a major impact on the entire colony. The effect on the Nannup area was twofold. Firstly, convicts provided the much-needed labour to undertake public works programs. Their major contribution was the construction of the road from Nannup to the Warren House (near Pemberton). Secondly the arrival of the convicts boosted the local economy through government supply contracts to provide food and materials to the convict work gangs. When convict transportation ceased in 1868 there was a general slowing down of the economy with the British government no longer buying farm produce.

The start of railway construction in Eastern Australia also had an effect on the region through the establishment of the timber industry.

SETTLEMENT

The period 1885 to 1914 was a period of considerable increase in settlement in the region. Factors effecting the pattern of settlement included the development of transport systems, roads and railway in particular, and the general growth and prosperity related to the gold rush. The development of the railway led to an increased demand for hardwood and for jarrah in particular for railway sleepers. There was a general movement of labour to the area to work in the timber industry and also for the construction of railways. There was also encouragement for those wishing to settle on the land with land grants created by the Land Act of 1898. As the area was opened up small towns developed and with them opportunities for business. A number of towns developed in association with timber mills in the area.

Nannup was officially declared a townsite in 1890.

TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION

The development of the railways was the most significant factor effecting transport in the area during this period. The South-western Railway was gradually extended into the region. The railway was extended to Nannup in 1909.

Road transport also improved with the construction of roads between the various small towns and settlements and the first motor vehicles appeared in the area.

Postal services developed with post offices constructed in various centres.

OCCUPATIONS

During this period the settlers in the region were occupied in a diverse range of occupations including various types of farming from cattle and sheep raising to mixed farming and fruit growing. There was also extensive employment in the timber industry, both in the early mills and in the forestry industry. Fruit became an important export crop in the area with developing markets both in Western Australia and overseas.

Mining of graphite near Donnelly River took place around the turn of the century. (Berry 1987) Although some graphite was shipped to the U. K. it was inferior quality and mining ceased after a few years.

SOCIAL & CIVIC LIFE

The period 1885 to 1914 saw the development of a system of local administration in the region. In 1887 the Nelson Road Board was established covering an area from the ocean in the south to Donnybrook in the north, Kojonup in the east and Capel in the west. Further division of administrative control occurred within the decade. In 1890 the Lower Blackwood Road Board was established in the Nannup.



During this period a number of small towns developed throughout the region providing services to the rural districts and the opportunity for social and civic life to develop. Churches provided a focus for community activity and balls and dances were popular pastimes. Sports were always popular in the region including football, cricket, tennis, rifle shooting and golf.

The first school in the area was opened at Darradup in 1900. The first school in Nannup opened in 1903 in the Agricultural Hall. A school building was constructed in 1905. (Gilbert 1973)

OUTSIDE INFLUENCES

In 1886 gold was discovered in the Kimberley region of Western Australia. Although these finds proved to be disappointing, they were the catalyst for increased migration particularly from the eastern states which were experiencing a period of economic depression following the end of their gold boom. In 1892 major finds of gold were recorded at Coolgardie 500 km to the east of Perth and the following decade saw the rapid expansion of the eastern goldfields centred on Coolgardie and Kalgoorlie.

Between 1885 and 1895 the population of Western Australia increased from 35,000 to 82,000. (Gains 1970) Increased prosperity and population led to development and the construction of numerous public buildings and public facilities including the railways. After the gold boom numerous fortune seekers stayed on settling in various parts of the state and seeking employment in numerous developing industries. In 1898 the Land Act was passed which offered miners the opportunity to settle on the land. Settlers were offered 160 acres on surveyed land, or more in unsurveyed areas as an incentive to settle the rural areas. The government issued *The Settlers Guide* and local committees were set up to advise and assist new corners. (Gains 1970)

Federation in 1901 had an effect on the state as a whole. The greatest effect of this however was probably not felt until 1914 when Australia as a whole participated in World War I.

SETTLEMENT

The period 1914 to 1945 was characterised by various attempts to settle the area, their failures and their successes. The most significant of these were the Soldier Settlement and the Group Settlement Schemes of the 1920s. A number of settlers arrived in the lower Blackwood area under the Soldier Settlement Scheme.

During the 1930s the area felt the effects of the Depression when world prices for primary produce collapsed, and many struggling settlers were forced off their land. Others survived this period by diversifying their farms or businesses.

TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION

Railways remained the main means of transport throughout the period. There was also considerable road construction and upgrading.

OCCUPATIONS

There were a wide variety of occupations in the region during the period. These included, mill work, forestry, road and railway construction, grazing, mixed farming including dairying, pig farming, poultry farming, fruit growing, etc. Trapping possums became illegal in 1920 but had previously been a lucrative fur export trade.

SOCIAL & CIVIC LIFE

The period 1914 to 1945 was characterised by an increase in community awareness reflected in the establishment of service organisations and clubs. This was partly a response to the major world issues of the period including two world wars and the Depression of the 1930s. It was also a response to the increases in local population and in community life in the area. Examples include the Red Cross branches which developed around the World War I period, R. S. L. which developed after the war, Country Women's Association and various co-operative societies.

Socially sports continued to play an important part in people's lives. Popular activities included tennis, golf, bowls, cricket, football etc. There were also opportunities for non-sporting recreational activities including amateur dramatics and dances.

During this period moving pictures also became popular. Most country towns were on a circuit with the movies and the movie operators moving from town to town on a weekly basis to show films. Films were shown in the Nannup Town Hall.

OUTSIDE INFLUENCES

The major outside events impacting on the development of the Nannup area during this period were two World Wars and the economic Depression of the 1930s. The end of World War I brought the introduction of new ideas and technology as men returned from overseas. There was also significant post war immigration initially from the United Kingdom but later from southern Europe.



The intervening period was characterised by the increased provision of services including electric lighting, telephone and radio and the rise in popularity of moving pictures. The Depression years of the early 1930s saw increased diversification of farms as farmers struggled to survive the collapse of world prices. Some were forced to abandon the land and move to the city.

During World War II the rural sector experienced considerable prosperity with markets requiring products for the war effort and the government instituting schemes to provide for these requirements. The role of women became prominent in the economy as men were required for the war effort.

SETTLEMENT

The post-World War II period was characterised by increased settlement in the area due to prosperity in the rural sector and to the government assisted migration programs from Britain and post war resettlement from Europe. In 1945 the War Service Land Settlement Scheme was established to enable the rehabilitation of ex-servicemen.

TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION

Railways continued to be important both for passengers and conveyance of produce. During the period motor transport became increasingly important. Roads improved and there was a large increase in private ownership of cars.

OCCUPATIONS

The timber industry continued to be central to the economy of Nannup. Fruit growing, especially apples continued to be a major agricultural occupation. There was also continuation of mixed farming and dairying. Service industries to serve the rural area increased in Nannup.

The increased accessibility of the area through private car ownership led to the development of the area as a popular tourist destination.

SOCIAL & CIVIC LIFE

The influx of new arrivals to the district joined an established community with a strong sense of identity. Many of the newcomers came from a range of different cultural backgrounds. Over time this cultural diversity enriched the community with the introduction of new skills, sporting, and cultural activities. In common with past arrivals, self-help community co-operation were features of the newcomers' efforts to establish themselves.

OUTSIDE INFLUENCES

After World War II the Australian government's immigration policy led to a large influx of migrants from the United Kingdom and Europe. The post war period was therefore characterised by programs to assist the resettlement of returned servicemen and the settlement of the new immigrant population. Immigration, combined with the natural increase in population in the baby boom years of the 1950s led to a need for housing and the 1950s and 1960s was a period of activity in the housing market with the State Housing Commission playing a prominent role. The period was generally one of prosperity for the rural sector with increases in population and the growth of community life.

SETTLEMENT

The period 1975 to 1995 has been characterised by decline in some sectors and development in other sectors of the region. Generally, there has been a trend towards corporate ownership of some rural industries and the decline of smaller operations. There has been an increase in the service sector with the gradual growth of Nannup as a service centre and the decline of some smaller towns. Settlement of the area has also been prompted by the growth of the tourism industry and by the attraction of the country lifestyle as an alternative to city life.

TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION

The period 1975 to 1995 has been characterised by the decline and closure of the once comprehensive railway service. The closest passenger railway service to Nannup terminates in Bunbury.

The increase in car ownership has reduced the emphasis on public transport services.

The development of electronic communications technology has facilitated transfer of information and provided benefits of time and efficiency for both local business and local government activities.

OCCUPATIONS

The timber industry and fruit growing have remained important industries throughout the period. Tree farming, especially blue gums, has increased in importance. Economic stability has largely resulted from the breadth of the economic base of the area generally. There has been an increase in the service and professional sectors largely focussed upon Nannup and including services provided through the local authority. Tourism has become an important area of employment including the hospitality industry, entertainment such as horse riding and the increase in local arts and crafts industries.

SOCIAL & CIVIC LIFE

The Nannup Shire offers a wide range of civic and recreational services including libraries, child health, senior citizens, and recreational facilities. The district also includes a wide range of sporting grounds and cultural facilities and there are a number of community organisations. Church and social gatherings still play an important role in community life.

OUTSIDE INFLUENCES

Outside influences during this period are mainly related to the general growth and development of the state of Western Australia. Generally, the period has been marked by the prosperity of the mineral boom of the 1970s, the corporate proposals of the 1980s followed by a period of comparative economic decline in the late 1980s and early 1990s. There has been decline in some aspects of the rural sector, but an increase in tourism and the service sector.



SETTLEMENT

The period 1995 to 2024 has been characterised by decline in some sectors and development in other sectors of the region. Generally, there has been a trend towards developments in the area by way of plantation growth and holiday accommodation. There has been an increase in the tourism sector with the gradual growth of Nannup as a tourism town and the decline of some smaller towns. Settlement of the area has also been expanded substantially by the growth of the tourism industry and by the attraction of the country lifestyle as an alternative to city life.

TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION

The period 1996 to 2024 has been characterised by the evolution of technology. This sees an emphasis on electronic vehicles that do not rely on the usual fuels we have seen in the past.

The increase in fuel costs is backing the increase in electronic vehicles.

The development of electronic communications technology is taking over and playing a major part in today's economy. There is a major dependency on technology, and it is evident when technology fails.

OCCUPATIONS

The timber industry has remained an important industry throughout the period. Tree farming, especially blue gums, has increased in importance. Economic stability has largely resulted from the breadth of the economic base of the area generally. There has been an increase in the service industry by way of holiday accommodation with holiday houses become a source of income. Tourism has become instrumental for employment including the hospitality industry, whole foods services and the increase in local arts and crafts industries.

SOCIAL & CIVIC LIFE

The Nannup Shire offers a wide range of civic and recreational services including libraries, child health, senior citizens, and recreational facilities. The district also includes a wide range of sporting grounds and cultural facilities and there are a number of community organisations. Church and social gatherings still play an important role in community life. With the increase in tourism there has been a substantial increase in community events throughout the Shire such as the Nannup Music Festival, The Flower and Garden festival, The youth Zone which is on weekly for the younger population and multiple bike events through the year.

OUTSIDE INFLUENCES

Outside influences during this period are mainly related to the general growth and development of the state of Western Australia. There has been a decline in some aspects of the rural sector, but an increase in tourism and the service sector.

There is some conflicting information regarding the history of Darradup House. According to information collected by the South West Heritage Taskforce in 1990, the original Darradup House constructed in 1868 by Stephen Longbottom was demolished following storm damage in 1951 and the remaining structure dates from circa 1900.

However following site investigation, the style of the building and building methods and materials used indicate that at least a part of the remaining structure was constructed prior to 1900. The site contains a number of timber framed structures including Darradup house, an outhouse a small cottage, shed, log structure and several more recently constructed sheds. Darradup House is a timber framed structure with a general 'T' shape floor plan with a gabled roof including prominent entrance and surrounding skillion formed verandah. Although most external features, including weatherboard dado, and 'nosed' timber detailing to door and window frames, is consistent, the roof and plan form suggest the building has been extensively modified. The existing cottage is constructed in two sections. The front section consists of three rooms and is constructed of wattle and daub which has been cement rendered on the outside. There are twelve pane sash windows on the front elevation. The original shingle roof has been replaced by corrugated iron. Asbestos wall linings have been added later. The rear section of the cottage was constructed later and is of timber framed construction with some pressed metal wall and ceiling linings.

HISTORICAL NOTES

The original Donnelly River Mill was established by the Wheatley family if 1912 and closed in 1914. The existing mill was built in 1948 and used by Bunnings until 1978. The mill was served by a network of railway lines. A largely intact example of a mill and mill town which is no longer working but which is capable of being conserved for tourism purposes.

DESCRIPTION

The Donnelly River Mill is constructed largely of local materials. The basic structure of the mill is the mill floor which supports the operating equipment above the floor and also the drive shafts, pulleys and belts under the floor. The initial power to operate all mill equipment came through shafts from a single steam engine. Though below the floor drive equipment was practice in timber mills and reflected the technology required to operate a mill by steam power, this is different from the usual practice in other workshops, which have drive shafts and pulleys in the roof and belt drivers coming down onto the work benches. The purpose of all drive equipment being below floor level was to achieve an open path for the movement of timber through the mill and also to improve safety. Nearly all the mill equipment is located under the main mill roof. The roof is of robust design and is made of two pitched segments joining at a central box gutter sheeted with standard corrugated roofing material. The support structure is all of timber construction; the support columns are of round bush timber, while the roof timbers, trusses and beams were constructed from sawn timber. The three steel chimney stacks are 20m in height and are stabilised with anchored guy ropes. A smaller chimney provided for exhaust of steam from the steam engines. The boilers generating steam for the engines are under a roofed area and are protected from the weather, while the boiler generating kiln steam is protected under a separate roof. Two of the original steam engines, which respectively provide direct belt power to the mill equipment and coupling to an alternator generating electrical power, remain in position and are protected from weather, though in need of maintenance. A third steam engine, which generated electrical power, has been removed apart from the engine block, while a diesel engine has been removed entirely. A fourth steam engine also used for power generation, remains in position. The original switching equipment and switchboards have been removed. Remaining in position are: the winch used to handle logs from trucks into the mill; the overhead winch for positioning logs on the travelling carriage; the travelling carriage itself; the twin saws which made the first log cuts; bench rollers; other saws; moving feed trollers and rails; packing case benches; the conveyor systems for waste transport, collection of sawdust from the bench saws and supply of sawdust to the kiln boilers: and, the shaft and pulley drive system under the mill floor. The drying kilns have been demolished, as has the large planer building where dressed timber was produced. The equipment has been removed from the site of the planer building and from the pre-cut areas and the second timber sorting table has also been removed. The rail system used to move timber in the storage yard has been dismantled.

The Nannup Hospital was officially opened on 10th October 1925 by the Minister for Health Mr Norm Baxter. The hospital is believed to have been operating for at least eighteen months before the official opening. The first resident doctor was Dr Andrews who was doctor in Nannup from 1922 to 1934. Miss Addie Lindsay was the first matron. The hospital was built by Mr Clay and his son-in-law Mr Worthington. Although fire destroyed most of the hospital records, it is known that surgery was originally carried out in Dr Andrew's rooms in Warren Rd. After the death of Dr Andrew's in 1934, the community raised funds to add on an operating theatre and labour ward, as a memorial to the respected physician.

While the Nannup Hospital no longer provides surgery services it continues to care for the aged and infirm, providing palliative care, an emergency casualty ward and health services.

DESCRIPTION

The Nannup Hospital was originally constructed in jarrah weatherboard and iron. Numerous extensions have been carried out over the years. These can be traced through the Public Works Department records.

The Nannup Timber Mill was built in 1925 after the closure of the Barrabup and Ellis Creek Mills. Previous mill owners were the Kauri Timber Company until 1963, Douglas Jones Pty Ltd, Millars and Bunnings. The original mill burnt down in 1954 and only the chimney remained. While the original mill was steam-driven, the new mill was powered by electricity. Mill cottages are located adjacent to the mill and form an integral aspect of the place.

DESCRIPTION



The Nannup Uniting Church was built in 1937 as a Methodist Church. Stone was hauled by horse and dray from Mt Folly for this building. The site originally also contained a church hall and manse on the south side which were used as a church until the completion of the present church. The hall was demolished after being badly damaged by termites. The first marriage to take place in the new church was held on 2nd April 1938 by Reverend Finch.

DESCRIPTION

The Nannup Uniting Church was designed with a rectangular floor plan and an enclosed projecting entry porch. The walls are constructed of random stone with brick quoins and reveals, terracotta wall vents, plain rendered windowsills and two plain rendered pilasters to each of the side walls. At the rear of the church a more recent skillion addition has been built using random stone and brick quoins to complement the original.

HISTORICAL NOTES

Suda's Shops were constructed circa 1910 for Mr George and were originally used as a chemist shop and a drapery shop. The property was purchased in 1937 by Mr William Blythe. The building currently houses a craft shop, the Nannup visitor information service and a restaurant. After the railway was extended to Nannup in 1909, Miss Winifred George opened a drapery here. It was supported several years late by her brother, the first chemist in Nannup. It was sold to W. O. White about 1925, the business was taken over by Bill Blythe (Snr) around 1937. Bill maintained the drapery, which later passed on to his son Bill (jnr) & his wife. In 1987, new owners Brian & Diane Gee opened 'Crafty Creations' here and it has been a craft & gift shop ever since.

In 2013 a feature film *Drift* was released after the shooting of the film was set here in Nannup, taking on the name of Seacliffe. This location was used because it had maintained the authentic Western Australian country town feel of the 60's & 70's. Suda's Shop / A Taste of Nannup played a central role in the production, standing in for the surf shop of the film's title.

DESCRIPTION

Suda's Shops are constructed of timber weatherboards with a corrugated iron roof.



HISTORICAL NOTES

The Westpac Bank Building was constructed circa 1928 for Tommy Gorman publican of the Nannup Hotel after the completion of the hotel extensions. The site includes the bank building, the adjacent café and a warehouse at the rear. The shops have had a variety of uses including grocery, hardware and butchers' businesses prior to the Bank of New South Wales taking over the premises. The Blackwood Café section of the building has had a variety of functions including café, hardware store and Boys' Club. The warehouse at the rear was originally a bakery. It was built for Wally Thompson who was the baker. Mr Thompson lived opposite and was previously the baker at Barrabup Mill.

DESCRIPTION

The Westpac Bank Building is constructed of rendered brick and iron with a bull-nosed verandah which is probably not original. The windows to the former bank section are not original however the re-entrant doors to the café are original as is the entrance to the bank. The warehouse at the rear of the site is constructed of random rubble with brick quoining and is probably earlier than the shops.
